Music in the Heart of the City

St. Paul's Episcopal Church will present the popular 'Music in the Heart of the City' series this Sunday at 4:00 P.M. The concert includes works for flute, piano, and voice. Featured artists this month are familiar to our concert enthusiasts. Townes Osborn Miller will return on the flute, Carl Angelo will again be at the piano, and Brittnee Siemon will be in accompaniment with her voice. This trio will fill the nave with beautiful music, with the title of the program aptly called ART SONGS.

Townes Osborn Miller is an Associate Professor of Music and Coordinator at Mott Community College in Flint, Michigan, and also serves as the Adjunct Flute Instructor and director of the Flute Choir at Saginaw Valley State University. She is the woodwinds coach for the Saginaw Bay Youth Symphony Orchestra and maintains a private studio.

Carl Angelo is the organist at First Presbyterian Church of Flint, Michigan, pianist for the Saginaw Choral Society, and an instructor of piano at Saginaw Valley State University. He is the winner of the 1987 American Guild of Organist Young Artist Competition in Indianapolis.

Brittnee Siemon, mezzo soprano, is a versatile performer, teacher, and scholar. Her accomplishments include premieres of early and modern works, a debut at Jordan Hall in Boston, and international appearances in Austria, Italy, Germany, Turkey, and Belize. Dr. Siemon has served on the voice faculty at Brevard College since 2016, and is currently the Vice President/Auditions Chair to the North Carolina Chapter of the National Association of Teachers of Singing. She is recognized internationally for her teaching and scholarly endeavors.

The concert is \$10 for adults and \$5 for students. Masks are no longer required when in the church, but are recommended.

'Music in the Heart of the City' is an exciting program that carries on St. Paul's tradition of excellence in diverse musical offerings in downtown Flint. One additional concert is planned this spring, featuring St. Paul's organist in residence Mr. Matthew Benkert.
