The Month began with my 37th anniversary as a priest and a 7-day conference at the Solomon Episcopal Conference Center in Rural Loranger, Louisiana. The Conference called CREDO is for priests of the church at different times of their short or long tenures. This one was for the retired set, and all expenses for the week, except \$500.00 is paid by the Church Pension Fund. It was a wonderful experience and I am grateful for the opportunity.

This coming week will be focused on the 150th anniversary of our building, events surrounding it and our Bishop's visit.
