#### Holly's Notes

My brother, Guy, died Christmas Eve at 4:25 pm of 2022. I have never talked about him much to many of you because he cut everyone off in Michigan in 2000. He called me in April of 2022, and we talked a lot this summer, reconnected and were planning to celebrate his retirement in July of 2023.

Guy was born, March 25, 1967, Good Friday when I was 2 years and 4months old. I stayed with my paternal grandmother when he was born and both of us spent many happy weeks and weekends with my paternal grandparents for all our childhood. They are our happiest memories, weeks spent every summer at their Upper Peninsula cabin on Caribou Lake, fishing, swimming, rowing, exploring my grandfather's gravel pit and 55 acres of forest. Free! Eating silver dollar pancakes, walking around the lake, laughing, and playing until we fell down. We were very close as children, an alliance against our parents, we never betrayed one another for any reason. This closeness resumed when he called me in April.

Guy was gay and was married to the love of his life, until Joe died of bladder cancer. Our parents are evangelical and would have never accepted Guy for who he was. It was easier for Guy to cut everyone off in Michigan and live his true life. I understand. You as my church family are probably wondering why I am explaining this to you?

This is why: the Episcopal Church, and its acceptance of all people, is so important to me. Therefore, I have fully supported gay rights and think it is important for us to have the Transremembrance service in November. It is important to me that all people learn of the love of Christ and that He will take them as they are, for who they are.

"They will know we are Christians by our Love" is a song I learned in my teens, written by a Catholic Priest. The church I came from, only

loved you if you followed their man-made rules. May we really love all people from all places.
