As was reported at the Annual Meeting last year, we started out with some struggles refreshing old and outdated information. The website is far from perfect, but it's getting better. Several corrections were made to the content, and pages have been added that will make the website a better source of parish information, and a good resource for those who want to know what is going on. Below are some of the improvements since last year:



# **FACEBOOK:**

Our presence on Facebook has shown quite a bit of improvement in 2022 for two reasons – The quality of posts has gotten better, and with the pandemic receding in the past, we have more community and parish activities to highlight.

One of the measures that the Facebook app provides to administrators is a metric called 'REACH'. Reach is the number of people who saw any content from your Page or about your Page, either because they visited your page, content from your page was shared by someone, someone checked into St. Paul's, or mentioned St. Paul's in a post. In 2022, our reach was 51,029 - THIS MEANS THAT 51,029 were exposed to the people, prayers, ministries and services in our church. In 2021, our reach was 37,421. Year over year, this is an increase of 36.4%.

As you can see from the graph below, by far, the parish activity that received the most community recognition was the All Saints' Day Ecumenical service in October.



### The other most popular community-wide events that were shared, recognized, liked and attended were:

- The Cornerstone Open House and Confirmation Service with the Bishop in May
- The Community Cleanup and Garden Cleanup in May
- The Blessing of the CRIM Runners in August
- Music in the Heart of the City Program in October Mr. POP-Ular
- Music in the Heart of the City Organ Concert in February
- 2nd Friday ARTWALK in June Carla Harden
- Pride Service in June
- Matthew Benkert final performance
- 150th Anniversary Reunion and Open House August

Although they do not receive as much reach as community events, worship activites within the parish were followed by many of those who recognize the value of a church family.

### The most recognized were:

- Blessing of the Pride Progress Flag
- Christmas Worship at St. Paul's
- Annual Blessing of the Animals
- The Children's Formation starts in October
- Shrove Tuesday Pancake supper
