Our St. Paul's Artwalk is amazing. Each month an artist presents beautiful art. Such an inspiration to see items made by hand, and hands with so much talent and inspiration. Some works will take your breath away when you imagine the skill and love placed in the work by the artist.

One of this month's artist is Kent Copeman. Kent graduated from central Michigan University with a secondary teaching degree with a major in art. After teaching K-5 in a one-room school for a year he went on to teach art in the Lapeer School system and later at Rocherster, Michigan. Kent studied the art of watercolor under Betty L. Schlemm, Roland Roycraft and Joe Green.

Kent has had his watercolors displayed at the Genysis Hospital, Vandandles Restaurant along with the Hadley and Almont Libraries. His paintings depict the locations that he and his wife, Reta, have visited throughout the years. Automobiles, barns and lighthouses tend to be objects that reflect his interest.

Rubato trio and Members are our musicians for the April Artwalk and will be performing a recital on April 23, 2023 at 4:00 p.m. at St. Paul's Music in the Heart of the City.

Rubato was formed in 2019 and is dedicated to entertaining and educating audiences on a wide variety of music from all genres. In addition to performing existing works and commissioning new repertoire for their unique ensemble, the trio also transcribes and arranges works written for other instruments to perform. Rubato's repertoire ranges from jazz to classical to music of other cultures and modern works, and their performances are infused with musicality, expressive playing and energy. 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Rubato founding member, flutist and Artistic Director Mary Procopio has been an active performer, educator, clinician and adjudicator throughout Michigan and New York. She was flutist, founder, and Artistic Director of the London Trio, a group that performed throughout Michigan as part of the Michigan Arts and Humanities Touring Program, including two appearances at the East Lansing Arts Festival. Mary has lectured on and premiered new works and arrangements for flute by Haitian composers at national and international conferences of the Society for Ethnomusicology, the College Music Society, the Haitian Studies Association, and the National Flute Association, and has been a quest lecturer and artist-in-residence at several universities and festivals in Michigan, West Virginia, and France. In 2014 Mary was a contributing author for the new Dictionary of Caribbean and Afro-Latin American Biography, and in 2006 she had two articles published in the Flut*ist Quarterly,* the international publication of the NFA. Mary has served on the Board of Directors for the Haitian Studies Association and the Southeast Michigan Flute Association, and has been the Director of Instrumental Studies at Mott Community College since 2006.

Saxophonist **Dirk Nieuwenhuis** has been an active performer throughout Michigan as a soloist and ensemble member in both jazz and classical ensembles. His jazz trio, *Moments Notice*, played throughout the Greater Flint area for various jazz and community events.

Dirk has been a long-time member of the Genesee Wind Symphony where he serves as co-Principal alto saxophone, as well as former principal alto saxophone with the Genesee Valley Concert Band and the Flint Concert Band. He has been a featured soloist with the above groups, as well as with the Mott Community College Concert Band, and has played in pit orchestras with Clio Cast and Crew, U of M Flint Theater, and through other venues. Dirk is also a member of Old Days, a professional Chicago tribute band that performs extensively throughout Michigan on concert series and at music festivals and community events. Dirk is a founding member of Rubato and performs on alto, tenor and soprano saxophone.

Pianist **Pat Cronley** joined *Rubato* in 2022 and has been a professional musician since age sixteen. While in high school Pat studied piano with Larry MacDonald, and credits that experience as the most influential of his musical career. (continued on next page)



While his main focus is jazz, Pat's unique pianistic approach lends itself to many styles. Pat also composesprimarily for Public Televisionincluding a work that won him an Emmy Award in 2011. In 2002 Pat founded Jazz on Wheels, a non-profit mobile concert series that performs for music festivals and community events, including their Friday night Jazz concerts at the old Farmers' Market in downtown Flint. Jazz on Wheels is designed to provide inner-city kids with muchneeded diversion and entertainment, and was initially formed to fill part of the void left by diminishing cultural and arts opportunities in the Flint school system. In 2022 JOW was awarded a Levitt AMP grant to produce a free concert series in downtown Flint in 2023 and beyond.

A Secure Beginning

With the help of a wonderful gift, our building now has a high efficiency security system installed by the local Sonitrol service.

The system will be armed from 11:00pm until 5:00 am everyday. With an access card, members of the St. Paul's community will be able to access the building without having to "buzzed-in" by our Administrative Assistant. Access will only be available through the Barth Hall door (#5) when the outside doors are unlocked.

Our plan is to have the outside doors unlocked most of the time except evenings when no meetings are taking place. If the event is not listed in the Master Calendar, the doors will not be open.

If you would like a card (or key fob) please contact our acting Junior Warden Becky (juniorwarden@stpaulschurchflint.com). There will be a deposit for replacement cost of the card (\$10) or fob (\$15) in case the card is lost. Please do not mark the card or FOB in any way that would give anyone information leading to the church.

Sonitrol has installed monitors in multiple places all over the church building so that our building, those who reside therein, and all of value will remain safe and secure.


