And she was so very faithful to St. Paul's. She and I frequently worked together, and together we dreamed great dreams. But Jelecia was not just a dreamer. She was a person who rolled up her sleeves, and did the work necessary to make the dreams a reality. Jelecia knew how to do that.

And for the last two years, as most of you know, she has fought valiantly and bravely. And in spite of her long illness, her indomitable spirit was never defeated. And so, her journey has come to an end, much to the heartbreak of our entire congregation.

But in reality, Jelecia's struggle was a great victory. Although disease shortened the length of her life among us, Christians know and believe that it is the *quality* of life that counts. And the quality of life is measured in blessedness.

Because, although Jelecia was dealt a tragic blow, it did not stop her from sharing her love for us—her family and friends. Although she suffered great physical pain, it did not stop her from doing good things and living her life with passion. Although she endured major surgeries and intense medical treatments, we could still see God at work through her. And that is blessedness.

Jesus said, "blessed are those who hunger and thirst after righteousness." What a fitting description of Jelecia's life. With God at her side, she led her life fighting for what she believed in. God was with her. And through God she has left a legacy of inspiration.

Is it better to be healed or to be blessed?

I believe and I affirm this day, giving thanks to God, that it is better to be blessed.

Crystal Turner & Friends – Spoken Word

Kirei is an Emmy Award-winning poetry slam champion, speaker, author, and BIPOC event curator from Flint. She shares spoken word to spark mindfulness, resilience, and connection. In July 2025, she released her complete collection of poetry and her next release is set for winter of this year.

As an artist, mother and master student, she is a founder of the prestigious collective, "The Sister Tour," a platform that promotes female artistry, from a kinetic sphere of positive influence, that exudes heart. I want to take a moment to thank everyone who made Back to the Bricks, the CRIM, and, most importantly, Jelecia's funeral service the events that they were this month. None of us could have done it without one another, and it is a testament to the love and support that we have for one another that we were able to make Back to the Bricks and the CRIM as successful as they were, and were able to come together to support and surround Jelecia's family and friends with love.

This upcoming month is a little bit quieter, which means it's time to revisit an idea that I've been putting on hold. How do we continue to help our community and help folks that ask us for help? I sat down with Tiffani from Family Promise this week, and we've decided to hold a fundraiser at the end of the month to support both Family Promise and the St. Paul's Assistance Fund. The fundraiser will consist of a yard sale on September 26-28 (Friday-Sunday), with anything that is not sold by Sunday being donated to area organizations. That means, if you're interested in donating something to be sold during the yard sale, please see Tiffani or I no later than Sunday, September 21. We are planning to pre-check everything that comes in, that way we can make sure that an organization will take it just in case. Items we are looking for are:

Clothes

Records

Small household items

Baked goods

Anything that can be fit into a car and easily transported

Family Promise of Mid Michigan and the St. Paul's Assistance Fund will be splitting the money made from the event, and then everything left over and not sold will be donated elsewhere. So whatever you bring will be used for a good cause. So far this year, I have had 30 people make over 25,000 in requests, with many more phone calls that were unable to be returned or helped. Between the funding from St. Paul's, the Barth Mission Trust, and private donations from parishioners, we've been able to help with nearly 7,000 in requests. So thank you, so much for everything that you do here which enables us to provide welfare in the city, and to act as a church with heart.

#### Hello everyone!

September is Sickle Cell Awareness month, last year we had Dr. Susumu Inoue present a presentation down in Barth Hall talking about Sickle Cell as that is a field he has spent his whole life working in. Through that we learned that it is a disease that disproportionately affects African American and Sub-Saharan African populations. Approximately 90% of cases in America are either African-American or Black Hispanic peoples, with it occurring in 1 in every 365 births.

This month will also see the beginning of Hispanic Heritage Month, and that means the return of the Ofrenda. If you have something belonging to a loved one who has passed away, please bring that in to be put with the Ofrenda in the Sister's Chapel. With it being Hispanic Heritage Month please keep at the forefront of our minds our Hispanic siblings facing oppression not just in California or Texas or Florida, but here in Flint as well. Over 50 people have been detained by ICE agents in our city. If you'd like to learn more about the issues surrounding immigration and the Southern border, I encourage you to read *Bishops on the Border* which you can find a copy in the library to read in your free time.


